	volunteers working in a rota. Owners of vehicles travelling over 35mph receive a letter	
	explaining the dangers of speeding with repeat letters or speeds over 50mph resulting in a visit	
	from the police. There are 7 approved location typically sessions run twice a week for 1 hour.	
	From February 2022 there have been 17 sessions resulting in 79 letters being sent out. Data	
	shows the speed indicator devices have a significant impact on driver behaviour with %	
	reductions seen ranging from 17 to 51%. Councillor James has been working with Andy Moore	
	from Suffolk Highways who gave a presentation about how and why to reduce speeding.
